
A Joke That Was Far From Funny

In the course of their work firemen are killed and injured, yet they face these risks without demanding particularly great rewards.

In Sheffield yesterday five firemen were injured when their engine crashed while answering a false alarm call. A car was wrecked, a factory wall damaged and the engine itself smashed. Two firemen were catapulted through the air and were lucky to escape with their lives.

These are men with wives and families waiting for them to return from their dangerous errands, men dedicated to saving lives and property from death and destruction. Anyone who does not see the with anger at the thought of this shocking incident might ask himself whether he would be prepared to live the fireman's life and run the risks that they do.
